PRESIDENT'S PONDERINGS...



This month I would like to focus on a couple of points that I suppose relate to etiquette but are less to do with the playing of the game we all love and more to do with being a good club member in general.

The first is punctuality. We ask that everyone be seated 15 minutes prior to start time and there is good reason for this, chiefly to do with the responsibilities of the director and scorer that most of us aren't aware of. There are many considerations as to which movement to use for any given session and the different movements have different setup tasks associated with them which all take time.

In small fields the director may be happy to run a Mitchell movement with full tables but when a pair arrives late we now have a phantom and a Howell movement may be preferred. This is because less boards are played per round with a Howell and we don't like the phantom pair to have to sit out three or four boards. But a Howell movement comes with its own challenges! Movement cards need to be printed and distributed to all tables and there are a lot less stationary pairs which makes it harder to accommodate those with seating rights.

In larger fields we typically run a lot of Web Mitchell movements these days to avoid only playing one board per table. However the layout of the boards is very different in a Web Mitchell depending on whether there is an odd or even number of tables. So once again a late addition can undo a whole lot of preparation.

Of course we appreciate that life happens and sometimes you will be running late. If this happens just call your partner or the club directly and let us know you're running late but you're definitely on your way. As long as the director is aware then there's no problem.

The second point is just a brief one and that is to please try to remember to wear your name badge. As we try to encourage more of our junior players to play in other club sessions outside of Wednesday night it does make them feel more welcome and sociable if they can put names to faces. If you've lost your badge and are after a new one talk to David and he can order you a replacement. If you're constantly misplacing it feel free to leave it at the club, we have a special spot for them in the foyer.




TIP OF THE MONTH #22



"Another challenging 3NT"

Bidding: South opens 1NT (balanced, 12-14). West considers a 2S overcall, but decides against it because of vulnerability and too few points. North raises to 3NT.

Lead: KS would be standard (declarer may have AJx and be finessable).

Play: You duck the first spade, but East encourages with 4S (low encourage), and a small spade comes round to East's JS and your AS. What now? Unless West has 7 spades and no other entry, you are in trouble.... as soon as you lose the lead to the AC, the opponents have 4 more spade tricks and you go 2 LIGHT

What can you do? You have 7 quick winners. Hoping to "sneak" a club trick before they play the AC is likely a forlorn hope. You must avoid Clubs and hope to make 2 more tricks in Diamonds. Play AD and another, finessing the JD, noting the 10D drops. You now go back to dummy (via hearts) and repeat the Diamond finesse. You can soon count up 9 tricks, contract made.

Lessons:

- The bidding is straightforward... although North has extra values, her/his only response is 3NT.
- 2. The critical issue in play is to realise you can't afford to play on Clubs. There is only one way to make 9 tricks, and that depends on East having the QD, (but if East has 4 diamonds to the Q10xx, and ducks, only the computer would finesse the 8D! If East has doubleton Qx, you will go 1 light, losing to west's 10D. So East needs to have Qxx or Qxxx, as was the case here).
- Note that as the cards lie you needed to get back to dummy with a heart to do the second Diamond finesse... play the hearts first and you will go light... everything depends on the finesse.
